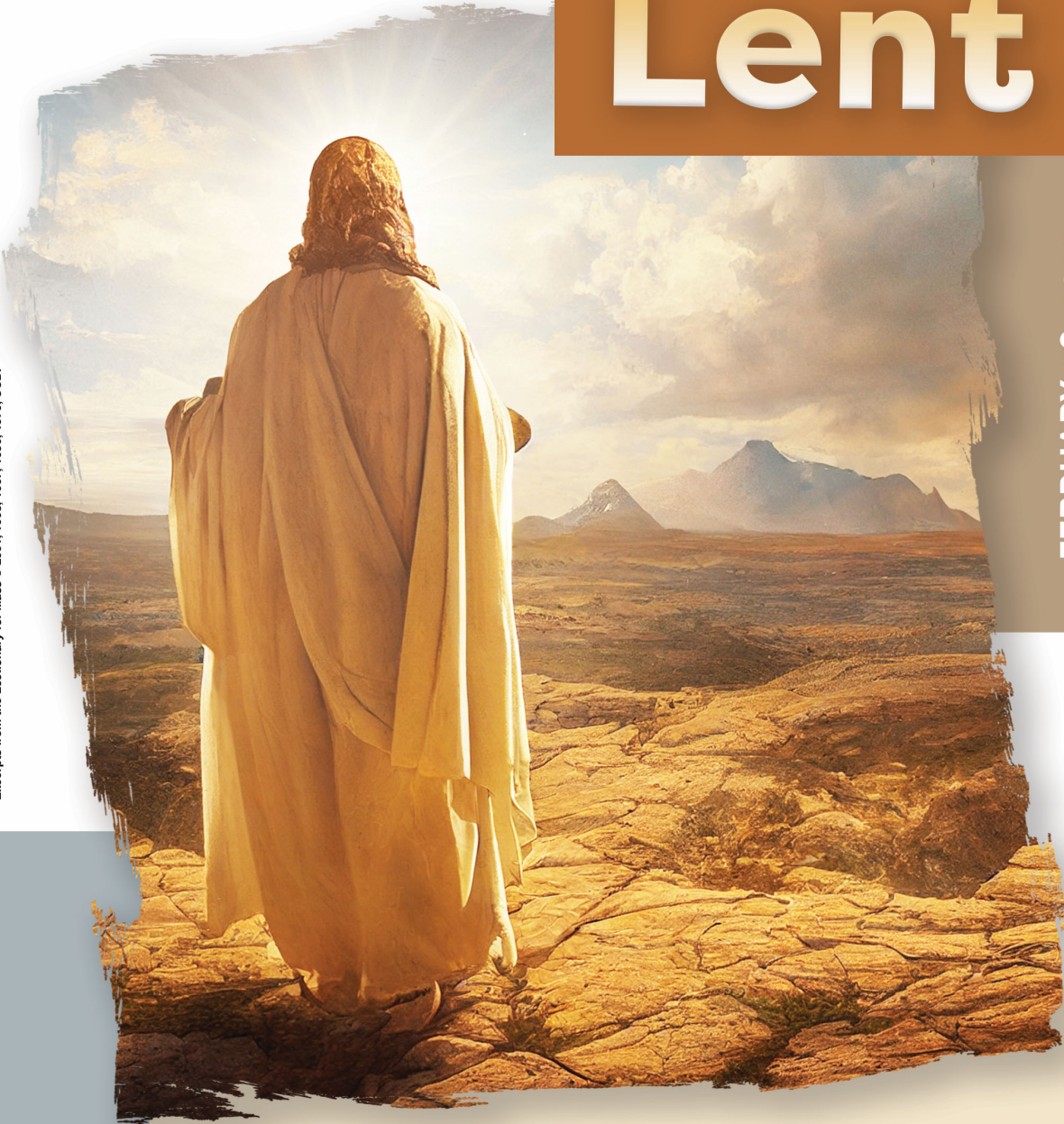

A Note from Father Bob

Dear Friends,

Grace and peace to you!

Happy Lent! Here we are, just a few days into Lent. Have you made any resolutions? Last Sunday Jesus exhorted all us to “Be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect.” If we don’t consider perfection in a human sense, in that how we might be successful, but rather in the sense that God wants us to consider being perfect, that is, to love as he loves, and to look at each other as he looks at us. Then, with his grace, it is possible to be perfect as he is perfect. Perhaps this Lent we can sit with God and ask him to help us with one of our imperfections that keep us from being as perfect as he is. He can help each to become as perfect as he is. This Lent let’s ask him.

Recently, we received word from our bulletin publisher, J. S. Paluch Co. Inc. that they were going to cease operations with the publication of this weekend’s bulletin. It is a sad day for their family-owned company which was founded 112 years ago. Unfortunately, the pandemic and costs associated with supply chain issues was more than their company could bear. Prayers for the company and their employees would be appreciated.

Next weekend our bulletin will be published by LPi. The company is over 60 years old and serves over 4,000 church communities. As we make a rapid transition to a new publisher, we can expect that there will be some bumps along the way. We ask for your patience. One notable change that you will see is that the bulletin will be 8 pages instead of 12. Church bulletins are subsidized by our advertisers so that it is no cost to the parish. Our current level of advertisers supports an 8-page bulletin. Thank you to all of our advertisers for your support!

Last year at this time, All Things New published Catholic Trends on the website. The first trend presented on the website is that of the decline in the number of Catholics in St. Louis. It is a startling trend. As I noted last year, and it still applies, this decline has an impact on Catholic life in all stages. What can we, you and I, do about it? Most importantly, we should look at how we look at evangelization. Evangelization is not something that someone else does. It’s our mission. It’s a mission like that the apostles had in the early Church. How do we evangelize? Everyone has different ideas and many of us have great fear about doing it ourselves. Fortunately, we have resources available to help. The most prominent is the Evangelization 101 Workshop. If you haven’t signed up you may go to archstl.org or scan the QR code on the poster in the Gathering Area. With God’s help, we can draw others closer to him.

Let’s pray for each other this week.

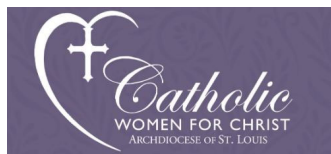

How do you deal with temptation? That's the personal challenge given to us by the Word of God on the first Sunday of Lent. And so we begin our journey with Jesus, traveling to the holiest place we can reach at this point in our lives.

This Lent is like no other. Last year, you had different needs, different areas of growth, different levels of insight and understanding. Much has happened since then, and all of it is a preparation for what the Lord is going to do in your life right now.

What victory do you need? What needs to be resurrected? To get there, Jesus will lead you through the cross of penance and self-denial, into his tomb, and out into God's light where his love provides healing and new life.

During Lent – and every time we make sacrifices and connect our sufferings to the Passion of Christ – we follow Jesus to the cross and to resurrection. This involves seeing our own crosses in a new light, for the Calvary Road is the only way to reach the victories that we yearn to experience.

If we want Easter to be more than just a holiday of colored eggs, chocolate bunnies and big dinners, we have to make Lent more than just 40 days of enduring an annoying, obligatory sacrifice, eating meatless pizza on Fridays, and going to an occasional extra event at church.

If we want to experience the power of resurrection, we have



to experience the power of mourning and repenting from our sinfulness. In other words, we have to experience the powerlessness of death – the death of our selfishness, the death of our worldliness, the death of our behaviors that are

not like Christ's.

Reflect & Discuss:

- † In the story from Genesis, what did Adam and Eve need to die to (let go of, put aside, or reject) in order to resist the Original Sin? Why didn't they?
- † In the reading from Romans, we hear about the abundant grace and the gift of justification that Jesus provided to each of us when he died on the cross. How does this grace and justification give us life? In other words, how does God help us to resist sin?
- † Looking at the Gospel passage, what did Jesus have to die to in the desert so that he could say no to temptation?

Lenten Activity:

What can you do this week to die to self? For example, think of a good deed you can do that's the opposite of what your selfishness wants you to do.
